

Public Health

Public Health is the science of protecting and improving the health of communities. The Bachelor of Science (BSc.) in Public Health at MUBS is designed to promote an interdisciplinary understanding of health and disease based on Public Health principles.

The degree aims to explore both quantitative and qualitative aspects of Public Health at all levels of analysis. Public Health students learn the methods in which the biological, social, psychological, environmental, and legal factors interact to influence human health.

At MUBS, the faculty members are qualified experts in their fields, who will provide instructional support in the classroom by mentoring, assisting, and teaching

Nutrition & Dietetics

The Nutrition and Dietetics is a three year program offered by the School of Health Sciences that encompasses completion of 97 credits including two practicums covering the Food Service and the Community Nutrition fields.

The program enriches students' knowledge with updated information in the field and allows them to apply it in order to promote healthy eating and lifestyle choices among individuals and groups as well

as those with special nutritional needs. Nutrition and Dietetics graduates play a role in enhancing the nutrition well-being and overall health of the served communities.

As per the Lebanese regulations of the MOPH and MEHE, graduates wishing to qualify as Licensed Dieticians should complete a paid six-months Hospital Dietetic Internship assigned by the department.

Career opportunities

Graduates in Nutrition and Dietetics have the opportunities to establish their own work practice as nutritionists, dietitians and wellness experts. They may also join public and private health organizations as food service specialists, community nutritionists, dietitians, and community counselors.



UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

MUBS welcomes new students to its growing and expanding schools: The International School of Business (ISB), The School of Computer and Applied Sciences, The School of Health Sciences, and School of Education & Social Work.

Admission Requirements:

REGULAR STUDENT

A regular student is a student who completed the official examination of BACC II or BT3 successfully, and received his/her official certificate from the Ministry of Education and Higher Education (MEHE), and has not previously enrolled in another college or university. Additionally, students who acquired an attestation from MEHE specifying that they hold a degree that is equivalent to the Lebanese Baccaureate would be considered as regular students.



U REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- 3 recent passport-size color photographs certified by mayor.
- 1 certified copy of the personal civil status record.
- 1 certified copy of the Bacc II degree or equivalent.
- 1 certified copy of the family civil status record.
- Certified copy of the official transcripts of the last three years of study (Tenth, Eleventh and twelfth grades).
- Certificate of Medical Health.
- A certificate from the National Social Security Fund (if applicable) , if not you must pay 135\$.

New student designation applies to the following student categories:

- Students who completed the Lebanese BACC II or BT3 successfully.
- Students transferring from other Lebanese or international universities.
- Graduate from Non-Lebanese Baccaureate program (Freshman Program only).
- International students.

Application Process:

- Early Registration period extended until August 7, 2020 to benefit from 50% deduction on the Application fees.
- Apply online at MUBS online application.
- 20% Financial aid for Undergraduate students during the Early Registration period.
- Fill the Financial aid online application if you need additional financial assistance.
- New applicants are exempted from Entrance Exams, except for the English Language proficiency test.
- Enrollment decisions will be based on students' grade 10, 11, and term 1 of grade 12 school transcripts.
- Students having a brother(s) or sister(s) registered at the University will benefit from a 5% discount.

TRANSFER STUDENT

Transfer student is a student who attended other recognized Lebanese or international university and wish to continue his/her studies at MUBS.

Application Process:

- Early Registration period extended until August 7, 2020 to benefit from 50% deduction on the Application fees.
- Apply online at MUBS online application.
- 20% Financial aid for Undergraduate students during the Early Registration period.
- Fill the Financial aid online application if you need additional financial assistance.
- New applicants are exempted from Entrance Exams, except for the English Language proficiency test.
- Enrollment decisions will be based on students' grade 10, 11, and term 1 of grade 12 school transcripts.
- Students having a brother(s) or sister(s) registered at the University will benefit from a 5% discount.

Student transferring from Technical institutes:

1. Copy of the official transcript signed by MEHE outlining the courses they studied for the respective grades of TS1, TS2, TS3 and LT years of study.
2. Student who sat for the official exams at the end of the TS3 year or the LT year has to submit a certified copy of the respective year's official certificate (TS3 or LT or both).
3. Student who failed the official TS3 or LT exams has to submit a copy of the official exam candidacy card alongside the copy of the official transcript signed by the Ministry of Education and Higher Education outlining the courses they studied during that year leading up to the official exams.

Student transferring from other Lebanese or Foreign University:

1. Official transcript from the attended university
2. Student who attended more than one university must provide official transcripts in addition to attestation from all university specifying that the student was in good standing and was not dismissed for any reason.

FRESHMAN STUDENT

Freshman student interested in joining MUBS at the undergraduate or graduate program level may do so by following the process listed below for his/her area of study after submitting all required documents.

Application Process:

- Early Registration period extended until August 7, 2020 to benefit from 50% deduction on the Application fees.
- Apply online at MUBS online application.
- 20% Financial aid for Undergraduate students during the Early Registration period.
- Fill the Financial aid online application if you need additional financial assistance.
- New applicants are exempted from Entrance Exams, except for the English Language proficiency test.
- Enrollment decisions will be based on students' grade 10, 11, and term 1 of grade 12 school transcripts.
- Students having a brother(s) or sister(s) registered at the University will benefit from a 5% discount.
